- 1. Distrust among businesses and government is the default starting point of business-to-government information-sharing initiatives. (This proposition pertains to this dissertation)
- 2. Simple information-sharing arrangements are preferred by organizations, whereas requirements are often gold-plated, resulting in complex and costly systems. (This proposition pertains to this dissertation)
- Essential for efficient information-sharing is that each actor has the same interpretation of the information.
- 4. Too much information-sharing leads to noise, whereas less can result in bias.
- 5. The implementation of the Video Assistant Referee (VAR) in football has failed.
- 6. Doing a PhD research is like shopping at a warehouse, PhD researchers start with a single thought and end—up with a pile of ideas and directions.
- 7. Preserving the Earth is a better plan than finding an extra-terrestrial habitat.
